Business “Type” Definitions

1. SMALL BUSINESS CONCERN

The term "small business concern" shall mean a business as defined pursuant to Section 3 of the Small Business Act and relevant regulations issued pursuant thereto. Generally, this means a small business concern organized for profit, which is independently owned and operated, is not dominant in the field of operations in which it is bidding, and meets the size standards as prescribed in Government regulations. Consult your Regional or District Small Business Administration office if further clarification is needed.

2. LARGE BUSINESS CONCERN

A business concern that exceeds the small business size code standards established by the Small Business Administration as set forth in code of Federal Regulation, Title Part 121.

3. WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS CONCERN

The term "women-owned business" is a business that is at least 51% owned by a woman or women who also control and operate it. "Control", in the context, means exercising the power to make policy decisions. "Operate", in this context, means actively involved in the day-to-day management.

4. MINORITY-OWNED - LARGE BUSINESS CONCERN

A concern which meets the criteria and definition in category No. 5, but which is not a small business by the U.S. Small Business Administration's standards.

5. DISADVANTAGED - SMALL BUSINESS CONCERN

The term "small business concern owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals" shall mean a small business concern which is at least 51 per centum owned by one or more socially and economically disadvantaged individuals or, in the case of any publicly owned business, at least 51 per centum of the stock which is owned by one or more socially and economically disadvantaged individuals. "Socially and economically disadvantaged individuals" include Black Americans, Hispanic Americans, Native Americans, Asian-Pacific Americans, Asian Indian Americans, and other minorities or individuals found to be disadvantaged by the Small Business Administration pursuant to Section 8(a) of the Small Business Act. The term "Native Americans" include American Indians, American Eskimos, American Aleuts, and Native Hawaiians. The term "Asian-Pacific Americans" includes United States citizens whose origins are from Japan, China, the Philippines, Vietnam, Korea, Samba, Guam, the U.S. Trust Territories of the Pacific, Northern Marianas, Laos, Cambodia, and Taiwan. The term "Asian Indian Americans" includes U.S. citizens whose origins are from India, Pakistan and Bangladesh.

6. NON-PROFIT BUSINESS CONCERN

Any organization not conducted or maintained for the purpose of making profit. Included in this category are: Sheltered workshops, universities, colleges, and local, state and federal governments.

7. FOREIGN-OWNED BUSINESS CONCERN

A business concern is considered to be foreign if it has its principal place of business outside the United States and is not incorporated within the United States.

A. HISTORICALLY BLACK COLLEGES & UNIVERSITIES / MINORITY INSTITUTIONS

- Historically Black Colleges & Universities (HBCU's)—The term "historically Black colleges and universities" means institutions that were established before 1964 and have a principal mission that was, and is, the education of Black Americans and that meet the requirements set forth by the Department of Education, Title 34, of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Part 608.2.
- Minority Institutions (MI's)—The term "minority institutions" means institutions and substantially increase the higher education opportunities for minority and/or low income students who are educationally disadvantaged or underrepresented in post-secondary education and meet the requirements set forth by the Department of education, Title 34 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 607.2.
